For to know God is to have chosen for yourself to live like that, simply because the spirit of it has become your own. There must be the discovery of the spirit of it all somewhere living within you.




## First reading: 2 Corinthians 13:11-13

### Reflection

Are you familiar with the “Fire Triangle” like the one shown here? The very existence of fire as a form of energy that is - a controlled combustion - the single most important element in our very survival as a life form. We use it for everything from cooking our veggies, to keeping us warm at night and for keeping away the night’s terrors. More than 90% of our manufacturing processes use combustion in some form. Fire promoted us from tree dwellers to our very presence in sharing this Church in a Bag today.



The primary purpose of a Fire Triangle is that fire cannot exist without all three elements of **fuel**, **air** and **heat**. Take any one of these elements away and there is no fire.



So, too, is the Trinity Triangle. Here we see at the apex, the God our Creator, known to us and to nearly all human cultures around the world. The status of God is above all and, by one definition, the ‘very *Air* we breathe’. There is a link to him. An agent. The go-between of Jesus, who has given our instructions in life. The **fuel** to burn for God’s

mission in this world. And to provide that energy (that spark of **heat** if you will) the Holy Spirit is given in us to create the passionate energy needed for purposes of acting outwardly, openly and actively for God.

Oh, and did you notice that the connection that holds the Triangle together is **love**?

## Second reading: Matthew 28:16-20

### Reflection: The Great Commission

With a reference to the earlier reflection on the requirements of fire, it must be pointed out that fire by itself *and not put to use*, is basically useless. So, too, is our connection to God. It may be not enough “to burn with God’s Spirit” if that is all we do. Power, by itself, is useless: unless it is used for the purpose to which it is intended.

Jesus Christ used the power of **love** to bind us together. If we want God’s power in our lives, then we must have his kind of power in our hearts; and with this power set to accomplish His purpose. “Go, then, to all peoples everywhere and make them my disciples.” Jesus didn’t say and mean this only for the *first responders* at Galilee.

There is the recollection of an old country minister who spoke at a little, white-framed country church: so small that if the bell tower rope wasn’t tied back, you hit it as you entered the door. But what was really appealing to those who exited by that same door was the clearly painted sign over it that read, “You are Entering a Mission Field”. Yes, this Commission is **on going** and **out going**. Remember He said, “Go to all the peoples everywhere”.



Isolated as we are by the presence of Covid-19, we can yet call on that inner ember of heat from our connection with God, poised and ready to go out again in the mission field, to say and show the Good News; to provide strength to the weakened; safety to the abused; nourishment and clothing to the starving; calmness to the worried and scared; and unjudging compassion and love to all who seek some betterment. What a great commission that is, for sure.
