For you created me and shaped me gave me life within my mother's womb. For the wonder of who I am, I praise you safe in your hands, all creation is made new.


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Closing Prayer

Reflection

Jesus shares with us another parable and by using stories he can teach at a number of different levels. There are also layers of meaning in these stories and I wonder if it sorted out those who simply came to see miracles and be entertained, from the serious followers who really wanted to understand Jesus' teaching. Jesus also told his stories to the crowds but kept the explanation for his disciples.

Carolyn, in her reflection last week on the parable of the sower, spoke about change and I wonder if this week's story/parable calls on us to think about a different outlook on life. We are human, and in that respect we are apt to make decisions that are not helpful – it is hard to distinguish between what serves as life (wheat) and what is damaging (weeds). In our communities and the world there is unfortunately so much hate and hurt. There seems to be so much division of "us and them".

I recently chose to be part of an email group to reflect on the anniversary of the reconciliation march. Each day of the walk included a reflection from an Indigenous Uncle or Auntie from all parts of Australia. The reflection "Walking Together with Vision" was one that really spoke to me.



The focus scripture was Jeremiah 29:11 "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future". And I quote "Our Heavenly Father has plans for all of us, but do we know what they are?" What a question and a challenge. The Uncle in this case spoke about seeking God, listening to his heartbeat and staying close to Him so that we can see the clear vision He has for us, not only this year, but beyond as well.

I believe the gospel reading for today calls for us to share love and that our errors of the past (thistles) will perish whilst the good seeds that are life-giving and healing will help with building a future where compassion, hospitality, peace and love will flourish.

What a vision to help change the world! Amen.
