Gather us in and hold us forever. Gather us in and make us your own.


Gather us in, all peoples together. Fire of love in our flesh and our bones.

## Reading Matthew 20: 1-16 Paying a Fair Wage

#### Reflection

It is very hard as humans, to accept that coming last is as important as coming first. And when we look at this story, our ideas about justice can say to us, the early-comers were not given a fair go.

Our concept of justice is often influenced by our own circumstances and by our opinions about what we and others deserve. We insist justice has to do with equality, but a lot of the time it's a word we toss around to keep people and things we don't like at bay.

Jesus has other ideas; he is eager to mess with our regular attitudes about what's right or fair.



Imagine God as the landlord – a landlord setting standards that in terms of normal, economic management seem absolutely ridiculous. No well-managed society can work successfully that way. This parable alerts us to the absolute fact that God's standards are based on

God's propensity to give, to care and to be gracious. To care for those who are both first and last. In the parable, the rules are set at the beginning and the end. They are not broken. They are fulfilled without question. Each worker is given life, respect, and justice.

This parable draws all its force and illustrative potential from the dynamics of economic life. Whom, then, should we think the landowner encounters when he's looking for workers late in the afternoon? What kind of people are the last to find jobs, added to the rosters only when there are no other labourers available? Nothing suggests that those characters in the parable are irresponsible or lazy. More likely, they are unwanted.

So then, if we turn back to worshipping God as Creator, the fountain of life; Christ, as the pulse of life; and the Spirit, as the breath of all life, how then do we as landlords of the world created for us do justice to that world?
