Readings: John 15:9-17 Reflection

Today's reading forms part of Jesus' long discussion with his disciples before his death. Jesus' words resonate through the centuries to inform our time and our discipleship. If we are really to hear what he is saying to us, we may have to face a change in our thinking.

Most of us were taught that being loving is the essence of Christian living. The emphasis in these verses, and indeed throughout scripture is on our being loved. It is from taking in love that the energy to give out love must come. There is a conviction among psychologists that people are constituted and maintained by love. When this does not happen, disastrous things can happen to a human being.

When we stop and think about it, we can usually see how significant people in our lives, like parents and friends, play a very creative role in our lives. They do this by accepting our weakness and our foibles, seeing beyond these to all the good in us. This good they affirm by appreciating all that we are, and encouraging all that we may become. They ask us to believe in their love for us and to believe in ourselves as loved and lovable. So significant people reflect back to us who we are and all that we mean to them. They put us in touch with a positive image of ourselves and in this way make and sustain us in life.

Too often the religious life is presented as a series of shoulds, oughts, and must. But today, Jesus comforts his struggling, fearful and anxious followers telling them, in effect, to relax. You didn't choose me. I chose you. And he chose us so that we could respond to his command to love - to love as he loved.

That means that love is a matter of giving, not getting; it means that loving is a matter of acting for the benefit and satisfaction of others, not ourselves. Love is thus not self-ish, it is self-giving, and only in that way can it be self-creating. So, let's thank God for all the people and the gifts, that have helped to create us. We are not here through our own efforts but rather through the gifts of many others: people who loved us and showed us the way, people like our mothers, for instance ... maybe? We didn't choose our mother figures. But look how God has blessed us through them. We didn't even choose Jesus. He chose us and he intends to bless the world through us.

"As the Father has loved me" says Jesus "so I have loved you; abide in my love. You did not choose me, but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last...I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another."

Lord, on this day set aside to honour and remember mothers, we give you thanks for our mothers. We are grateful that you chose to give us life through them, and that they received the gift of life from your hands, and gave it to us.

Hear now the first names of other women who have inspired us by their motherly examples . . .(name them in silence). We are mindful this day of all these women, and especially Mary the mother of our Lord Jesus Christ, who had the courage in faith to say "yes" to Your calling. May we be able to emulate these examples of faith. And may they model for all the rest of us what it means to be your disciple. Bless our good mother figures on this special day; in the name of Jesus Christ.
